**Johnson** 

<u>Prior law</u> prohibited a managed care organization (MCO) from paying a local pharmacy a per-prescription reimbursement at a rate less than the legacy Medicaid rate unless its contract with the La. Dept. of Health (LDH) provided for a reimbursement dispute process.

<u>New law</u> prohibits an MCO from paying a local pharmacy a per-prescription reimbursement at a rate less than the legacy Medicaid rate by repealing the option to include a reimbursement dispute process to allow a reimbursement rate less than the legacy Medicaid rate.

<u>Prior law</u> authorized an MCO to negotiate the ingredient cost reimbursement in its contracts with providers.

New law repeals prior law.

<u>Prior law</u> required any contract between LDH and an MCO that included provisions for pharmacy reimbursement to provide for a reimbursement dispute process for local pharmacies.

New law repeals prior law.

<u>Prior law</u> required the full cost of implementing and performing the provisions of <u>prior law</u> to be the responsibility of LDH through a reallocation of existing budget resources and not through additional appropriations.

New law repeals prior law.

Effective October 1, 2017.
