Prior law provided the following fees for insurance producer licenses:

Producer renewal fee (every two years)
Property and casualty producer
First time applicant
Additional or renewal company appointment (yearly) \$20.00
Producer renewal fee (every two years)\$50.00
Limited lines producer
First time applicant
Each additional line of authority
Additional or renewal company appointment (yearly) \$20.00
Renewal fee (every two years)\$50.00
Limited lines credit insurance producer
First time applicant
Additional or renewal company appointment (yearly) \$20.00
Renewal fee (every two years)\$50.00
Surplus lines broker
First time applicant
Renewal fee (every two years)\$350.00
Fee for failure to file producer license renewal timely (per license) \$50.00
Fee for duplicate producer license. \$15.00

<u>New law</u> retains the current fees for surplus lines producers and the fee for failure to timely file a producer license renewal.

<u>New law</u> creates an "all other lines" category of insurance producers for the purpose of unifying the fee structure and renewal periods for the following insurance producer licenses: life, health, and annuities; property and casualty; limited lines; and limited lines credit insurance. <u>New law</u> retains the fee structure for producers in these categories.

New law creates the following fee structure for all other lines of producer licenses:

First time applicant	5.00
Application to add lines	0.00
Initial or renewal company appointment (yearly) \$20	0.00
Producer renewal fee (every two years):	
One line	0.00
Two or more lines	5.00

Existing law provides that a business entity acting as an insurance producer is required to obtain an insurance producer license and that any person who directly or indirectly controls 10% or more of such entity shall be registered with the Department of Insurance under such business entity's license.

<u>New law</u> limits the requirement to register controlling persons to resident business entities. <u>New law</u> adds a requirement for non-resident business entities to provide that information to the commissioner of insurance upon request.

Effective January 1, 2018.
