RETIREMENT/CLERKS COURT: Provides relative to the reemployment of retirees of the Clerks' of Court Retirement and Relief Fund

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 11:1513(A) and (B) and to repeal R.S. 11:1513(C) and (D),
3	relative to the reemployment of retirees of the Clerks' of Court Retirement and Relief
4	Fund; to provide for the number of days a retiree may be reemployed without benefit
5	reduction; to require payment of employer contributions during reemployment; and
6	to provide for related matters.
7	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published
8	as provided by Article X, Section 29(C) of the Constitution
9	of Louisiana.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 11:1513(A) and (B) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as
12	follows:
13	§1513. Reemployment of a retiree
14	A. Except as provided in Subsection B of this Section, a A retiree receiving
15	retirement benefits from the system may be temporarily reemployed by a clerk, but
16	the retiree shall not be or become a member of the system during such
17	reemployment. If the retiree is reemployed in any capacity for more than sixty
18	ninety working days, or the equivalent thereof, during any calendar year, the benefits
19	payable to the retiree shall be reduced by the amount he earned after sixty ninety
20	working days, or the equivalent thereof, during that calendar year. The retiree and

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the clerk shall immediately notify the board of the date of reemployment, the amount of salary paid, any changes in salary, the number of hours employed per week, the estimated duration of reemployment, and the date of the termination of the reemployment. If the retiree dies during reemployment, benefits shall be paid to any other person as if death occurred regardless of reemployment pursuant to any option which may have been selected by the retiree at the time of retirement.

7 B. (1) A retiree who has terminated employment and was receiving 8 retirement benefits from the system on January 1, 2007, may be temporarily 9 reemployed by a clerk whose office is located in a parish designated under the 10 Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act as eligible for 11 individual assistance, or individual assistance and public assistance following 12 hurricane Katrina or Rita; however, the retiree shall not be or become a member of 13 the system during such reemployment. If the retiree is reemployed by such a clerk 14 in any capacity for more than one hundred eighty working days, or the equivalent 15 thereof, during any calendar year, the benefits payable to the retiree shall be reduced 16 by the amount he earned after one hundred eighty working days, or the equivalent 17 thereof. The retiree and the clerk shall immediately notify the board of the date of 18 reemployment, the amount of salary paid, any changes in salary, the number of hours 19 employed per week, the estimated duration of reemployment, and the date of the 20 termination of the reemployment. If the retiree dies during reemployment, benefits 21 shall be paid to any other person as if death occurred regardless of reemployment 22 pursuant to any option which may have been selected by the retiree at the time of 23 retirement.

(2) Except as provided in Subsection C of this Section regarding certain
retirees reemployed by the clerk of the Orleans Parish Civil District Court, the
provisions of Paragraph (1) of this Subsection shall expire on July 1, 2012, and
thereafter shall be null and void and of no effect.

28During any period of reemployment after June 30, 2018, whether or not the29person is an employee as defined in this Chapter, the employer shall make employer

2 shall receive no additional service credit and shall not accrue any additional

3 retirement benefit in the retirement system. Upon termination of reemployment, the

4 system shall retain the employer contributions and interest on such contributions.

5 Section 2. R.S. 11:1513(C) and (D) are hereby repealed in their entirety.

6 Section 3. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2018; if vetoed by the governor

7 and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on July 1,

8 2018, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.

Abstract: Requires the payment of employer contributions for all retirees who return to work in a position covered by the Clerks' of Court Retirement and Relief Fund (the system) and extends the time period during which a retiree may return to work without benefit reduction.

<u>Present law</u> allows retirees of the system to be temporarily reemployed by a clerk without becoming a member of the system during such reemployment. <u>Present law</u> further provides that if the retiree is reemployed in any capacity for more than the equivalent of 60 working days during any calendar year, the retirement benefits shall be reduced by the amount he earned after 60 working days. <u>Proposed law</u> increases the time period that a retiree may work during a calendar year without benefit reduction from 60 working days to 90 working days.

<u>Present law</u> requires that employers remit employer contributions to the system while the member is an active member. <u>Proposed law</u> requires that employers pay employer contributions to the system as provided by <u>present law</u> during any period of reemployment on or after June 30, 2018. <u>Proposed law</u> applies to retirees who return to work in part-time or full-time positions. Upon termination of reemployment, <u>proposed law</u> provides for the system to retain the employer contributions and interest on such contributions.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a retiree who was receiving retirement benefits from the system on Jan. 1, 2007, may be reemployed by a clerk whose office is located in a parish designated under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act as eligible for individual assistance or individual and public assistance following hurricane Katrina or Rita without benefit reduction for up to 180 working days. <u>Present law</u> provides that such provision, except as it applies to retirees reemployed by the clerk of the Orleans Parish Civil District Court, expired on July 1, 2012. <u>Present law</u> further provides for temporary reemployment of a retiree employed by the clerk of the Orleans Parish Civil District Court on or before June 30, 2012, under the same conditions. <u>Present law</u> provides that such provision expired on July 1, 2013. <u>Proposed law</u> repeals <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a retiree who was receiving retirement benefits from the system on Jan. 1, 2007, and who is temporarily reemployed by the Orleans Parish Civil District

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Court on or before June 30, 2012, may work for a period of 90 working days during a calendar year. <u>Present law</u> provides that such provision expired on July 1, 2014. <u>Proposed law</u> repeals <u>present law</u>.
