DIGEST 2018 Regular Session

Claitor

<u>Present law</u> provides that any person operating a motor vehicle on the public roads of this state is to drive in a careful and prudent manner, so as not to endanger the life, limb, or property of any person. <u>Present law</u> further provides that failure to drive in such a manner constitutes careless operation.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that <u>present law</u> relative to careless operation includes the operation of a motor vehicle in a manner that creates a wake during flood conditions.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a first violation of <u>present law</u> is punishable by a fine of up to \$175, or imprisonment for up to 30 days, or both. <u>Present law</u> provides that a subsequent violation is punishable by a fine of up to \$500, imprisonment for up to 90 days, or both.

Proposed law retains present law.

SB 68 Original

<u>Present law</u> provides that careless operation of a watercraft is the operation of a watercraft in a careless manner so as to endanger the life, limb, or property of any person, when such operation constitutes a violation of any requirements for the operation of a watercraft as enumerated in <u>present</u> law.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that careless operation of a watercraft includes the operation of a watercraft when such operation creates a wake during flood conditions that endangers the life, limb, or property of any person.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the crime of careless operation of a watercraft is punishable by a fine of up to \$300, imprisonment for up to 30 days, or both.

Proposed law retains present law.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
