PUBLIC CONTRACTS. Requires that any contractor who enters into a contract with a state entity comply with the Louisiana Equal Pay for Women Act. (8/1/18)

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 23:663(3) and R.S. 39:1625 and to enact R.S. 38:2216(N),
3	relative to the Louisiana Equal Pay for Women Act; to provide for employment by
4	employers who contract with the state; to provide for state procurement contracts;
5	to provide for state services contracts; to provide for definitions; to require certain
6	acknowledgments in contacts; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 23:663(3) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
9	§663. Definitions
10	As used in this Chapter, the following terms shall have the definitions
11	ascribed in this Section unless the context indicates otherwise:
12	* * *
13	(3) "Employer" means any all of the following:
14	(i) Any department, office, division, agency, commission, board, committee,
15	or other organizational unit of the state.
16	(ii) Any business or person that enters into a procurement contract,
17	pursuant to Title 38 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, with any

department, office, division, agency, commission, board, committee, or other
organizational unit of the state.

(iii) Any business or person that enters into a contract for services, pursuant to Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, with any department, office, division, agency, commission, board, committee, or other organizational unit of the state.

Section 2. R.S. 38:2216(N) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§2216. Written contract and bond

9 * * *

N. Any written contract entered into with any department, office, division, agency, commission, board, committee, or other organizational unit of the state shall contain an acknowledgment by the contractor that contractor is subject to the provisions of Chapter 6-A of Title 23 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950.

Section 3. R.S. 39:1625 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: §1625. Contract content

Each contract for professional, personal, consulting, or social services entered into by a governmental body as defined in R.S. 39:1556(24) shall contain as a minimum: description of the work to be performed and objectives to be met; amount and time of payments to be made; description of reports or other deliverables to be received, when applicable; date of reports or other deliverables to be received, when applicable; responsibility for payment of taxes, when applicable; circumstances under which the contract can be terminated either with or without cause; remedies for default; an acknowledgment by the contractor that contractor is subject to the provisions of Chapter 6-A of Title 23 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950; and a statement giving the legislative auditor the authority to audit records of the individual or firm.

Morrell

Present law provides for The Equal Pay for Women Act.

<u>Present law</u> provides that women working as employees of the state of Louisiana shall be entitled to the same compensation as men employed by the state of Louisiana. <u>Present law</u> prohibits an employer from paying wages to an employee at a rate less than the rate at which the employer pays wages to another employee of the opposite sex for the same or substantially similar work within the same state agency.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but extends <u>present law</u> to cover any business or person who enters into a procurement or services contract with any department, office, division, agency, commission, board, committee, or other organizational unit of the state.

Present law defines "employer" as an organizational unit of state government.

 $\underline{\text{Proposed law}}$ extends the definition of "employer" $\underline{\text{from}}$ an organizational unit of the state $\underline{\text{to}}$ also include employers who contract with the state.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that any written procurement or services contract entered into with any department, office, division, agency, commission, board, committee, or other organizational unit of the state contain an acknowledgment by the contractor that contractor is subject to the provisions of The Equal Pay for Women Act.

Effective August 1, 2018.
