**Abstract:** Authorizes the Teche-Vermilion Fresh Water District to enhance the regional watershed.

<u>Present law</u> creates the Teche-Vermilion Fresh Water District for the purpose of establishing, maintaining, and protecting a fresh water supply in Bayou Teche and the Vermilion River.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands the district's authority to enhance the regional watershed.

<u>Present law</u> grants the district the following powers:

- (1) To buy and sell; to own, maintain and operate property within and without the district.
- (2) To acquire servitudes and rights-of-way within and without the district.
- (3) To grant and fulfill assurances of local participation in connection with any <u>state or</u> federal project.
- (4) To negotiate and execute contracts.
- (5) To expropriate the rights-of-way required to construct a specific project authorized by the U.S. Congress.
- (6) To cooperate with the state and federal government and their agencies to establish, construct, operate, and maintain the fresh water system.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> except removes the authority to expropriate rights-of-way for the specific congressionally approved project and grants the authority to expropriate for the purpose of regional watershed enhancement. <u>Proposed law</u> also clarifies the district's contracting authority.

Proposed law grants the district the following additional powers:

- (1) To perform any other necessary and ancillary acts to effectuate its functions, to perform its duties, or to give effect to its powers.
- (2) To enhance the regional watershed through performing, to include but not limited to, developing, constructing, and maintaining flood control measures and structures and public access and recreation facilities; engaging in public relations and government relations;

financial and financing assistance; tax abatement; planning and coordination for water flow; waterway training, technical assistance, and technology transfer; facilitate improvements; promoting transfer of ideas to commercially successful utilization by local enterprises; promoting the development of new products, processes, or services or new uses for existing products, processes, or services; engaging in any activities and projects it deems most appropriate to encourage and assist water flow, drainage, flood abatement and other water uses.

<u>Present law</u> provides that <u>present law</u> does not impair the right and authority of municipalities or police juries to create, maintain, and operate waterworks districts and sub-waterworks districts. Proposed law retains present law.
