PHARMACISTS: Requires that pharmacists report to certain parties when refills of certain psychiatric medications go undispensed

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 37:1224.2, relative to the practice of pharmacy; to require pharmacists to
3	report instances of undispensed prescriptions in certain cases; to provide relative to
4	pharmacy services for patients who are prescribed certain psychiatric medications;
5	to the Louisiana Board of Pharmacy to promulgate administrative rules; and to
6	provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 37:1224.2 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§1224.2. Psychiatric medications; undispensed refills; reporting
10	A. When a person has been prescribed a refill of a prescription of a
11	psychiatric medication provided for in Subsection B of this Section and the refill
12	remains undispensed after the period of time provided for in Subsection B of this
13	Section lapses, the pharmacist shall report to the following persons that the
14	prescription has not been dispensed:
15	(1) The prescriber who prescribed the medication to the patient.
16	(2) Any person listed in the records of the pharmacy as a family member
17	contact or other designated contact for the patient.
18	B. The board shall promulgate in rule all of the following:
19	(1) The listing of psychiatric medications which shall subject a patient to the
20	reporting requirement provided in Subsection A of this Section.

Abstract: Requires pharmacists to report to a patient's prescriber and designated contact, if any, when refills of certain psychiatric medications go undispensed.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that when a person has been prescribed a refill of a prescription of a psychiatric medication provided for in <u>proposed law</u> and the refill remains undispensed for a certain amount of time, the pharmacist shall report to the following persons that the prescription has not been dispensed:

- (1) The prescriber who prescribed the medication to the patient.
- (2) Any person listed in the records of the pharmacy as a family member contact or other designated contact for the patient.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the La. Board of Pharmacy to promulgate in rule all of the following:

- (1) The listing of psychiatric medications which shall subject a patient to the reporting requirement provided in <u>proposed law</u>.
- (2) The time period for a prescription remaining undispensed which shall subject a patient to the reporting requirement provided in proposed law.
