RETIREMENT/MUNICIPAL EMP: Provides for computation of a supplemental benefit for reemployed retirees of the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of Louisiana

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 11:1762.1(B), relative to the retirement benefit of reemployed 3 retirees of the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of Louisiana; to provide for 4 computation of a retirement benefit under certain reemployment circumstances; and 5 to provide for related matters. 6 Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published 7 as provided by Article X, Section 29(C) of the Constitution 8 of Louisiana. 9 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 10 Section 1. R.S. 11:1762.1(B) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 11 §1762.1. Full-time reemployment of retirees 12 13 B. The supplemental benefit when combined with the original benefit shall 14 not exceed the final compensation figure used to compute the original benefit or the 15 supplemental benefit, whichever is greater. 16 17 Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2018; if vetoed by the governor 18 and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on July 1, 19 2018, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.

Abstract: Changes the maximum supplemental benefit allowed to reemployed retirees of the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of La. (MERS).

<u>Present law</u> provides that a retiree of MERS who is reemployed in a full-time position shall have his retirement benefit suspended, but may accrue a supplemental retirement benefit if reemployed for at least 12 months. Upon retirement after reemployment, MERS shall resume payment of his original retirement benefit and begin payment of any accrued supplemental benefit. The supplemental benefit when combined with the original benefit shall not exceed the final compensation figure used to compute the original benefit.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that upon retirement after reemployment, the supplemental benefit when combined with the original benefit shall not exceed the final compensation figure used to compute the original benefit, or the supplemental benefit, whichever is greater.

Effective July 1, 2018.
