Requires third-party logistics providers to obtain controlled dangerous substance licenses

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "third-party logistics provider" in the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law. <u>Present law</u> requires persons conducting research with, manufacturing, distributing, procuring, possessing, prescribing, or dispensing any controlled dangerous substance in Louisiana to hold a Controlled Dangerous Substance License issued by the LA Board of Pharmacy. <u>Present law</u> allows the LA Board of Pharmacy to collect fees associated with the issuance of Controlled Dangerous Substance Licenses. <u>Proposed law</u> requires third-party logistics providers to hold a Controlled Dangerous Substance Licenses and allows the LA Board of Pharmacy to collect a \$50 fee for the issuance of such license.

## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. Proposed law adds a new category for Controlled Dangerous Substance (CDS) licenses issued by the LA Board of Pharmacy.

## **REVENUE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure. Proposed law adds the category of "third-party logistics provider" and a \$50 license fee to the licensing and fee schedule for Controlled Dangerous Substance (CDS) licenses issued by the LA Board of Pharmacy, and requires third-party logistics providers to hold CDS licenses if transporting controlled dangerous substances in Louisiana. However, the LA Board of Pharmacy reports that third-party logistics providers currently transporting controlled dangerous substances in Louisiana already operate using CDS licenses designated for distributors, which also carry a \$50 license fee. Therefore, the addition of the "third-party logistics provider" category will not affect revenue collections in the aggregate, as third-party logistics providers will now be licensed in their own category with the same \$50 license fee, rather than as distributors.

For reference, the LA Board of Drug and Device Distributors reports 25 third-party logistics providers in Louisiana transporting and distributing controlled dangerous substances.
