Abstract: Provides a monetary exemption for highway designations honoring military personnel, law enforcement officers, and firefighters killed in the line of duty.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits the Dept. of Transportation and Development from requiring monies be received to alleviate costs, including payments to contractors, associated with the installation and maintenance of signage reflecting highway designations honoring military personnel, law enforcement officers, or firefighters killed in the line of duty.

(Adds R.S. 48:2001)

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Transportation</u>, <u>Highways and Public Works</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

1. Remove the maximum of five designations per legislator and require the monetary exemption apply to all designations honoring military personnel, law enforcement officers, and firefighters killed in the line of duty.
