1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To recognize May 9, 2018, as "Purple and Teal Day" in the state of Louisiana.
3	WHEREAS, the members of the Legislature of Louisiana recognize the need to
4	address violence against women; and
5	WHEREAS, domestic violence and sexual assault are serious crimes that affect
6	people of all races, ages, genders, and income levels; and
7	WHEREAS, domestic violence and sexual assault are widespread and affect millions
8	of Americans each year; and
9	WHEREAS, Louisiana currently ranks third in the nation for domestic homicides,
10	having consistently led the nation for the past two decades; and
11	WHEREAS, over 1.1 million women and men in Louisiana are sexually assaulted
12	during their lifetimes, costing individuals, employers, and governmental institutions an
13	average of one hundred twenty-two thousand four hundred sixty-one dollars per rape; and
14	WHEREAS, the crimes of domestic violence and sexual assault violate an
15	individual's privacy, dignity, security, and humanity due to the systematic use of physical,
16	emotional, sexual, psychological, and economic control and abuse; and
17	WHEREAS, on May 9, 2018, the Louisiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence
18	and the Louisiana Foundation Against Sexual Assault host their annual day at the state

capitol with a display in The Louisiana Veterans Park and Memorial Hall of the capitol; and
