A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To recognize May 9, 2018, as "Purple and Teal Day" in the state of Louisiana.

WHEREAS, the members of the Legislature of Louisiana recognize the need to address violence against women; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence and sexual assault are serious crimes that affect people of all races, ages, genders, and income levels; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence and sexual assault are widespread and affect millions of Americans each year; and

WHEREAS, Louisiana currently ranks third in the nation for domestic homicides, having consistently led the nation for the past two decades; and

WHEREAS, over 1.1 million women and men in Louisiana are sexually assaulted during their lifetimes, costing individuals, employers, and governmental institutions an average of one hundred twenty-two thousand four hundred sixty-one dollars per rape; and

WHEREAS, the crimes of domestic violence and sexual assault violate an individual's privacy, dignity, security, and humanity due to the systematic use of physical, emotional, sexual, psychological, and economic control and abuse; and

WHEREAS, on May 9, 2018, the Louisiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence and the Louisiana Foundation Against Sexual Assault host their annual day at the state

1 capitol with a display in The Louisiana Veterans Park and Memorial Hall of the capitol; and

2 WHEREAS, the Louisiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence is the federally
3 designated statewide coalition of shelters, nonresidential programs, and individuals working
4 to end domestic violence in Louisiana; and

5 WHEREAS, the Louisiana Foundation Against Sexual Assault is the federally
6 designated membership organization of sexual assault crisis centers, allied professionals, and
7 individuals dedicated to preventing sexual violence and supporting survivors across
8 Louisiana; and

9 WHEREAS, Purple and Teal Day provides an excellent opportunity for the citizens
10 of Louisiana to learn more about preventing domestic violence and sexual assault and to
11 show support for the numerous organizations and individuals who provide critical advocacy,
12 services, and assistance to victims.

13 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
14 recognize May 9, 2018, as "Purple and Teal Day" in the state of Louisiana, does hereby
15 commend and encourage diligence to prevent violence against women, and does hereby urge
16 all citizens and all community organizations to join in this observance.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
18 Louisiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence.
