## A RESOLUTION

To commend James K. Elrod upon being honored as a Louisiana Public Broadcasting Louisiana Legend.

WHEREAS, since then, he has remained deeply committed to building an excellent hospital system dedicated to the service of its community and its patients, particularly reaching out to provide medical services to the underserved; and
