Subject to the limits of Paragraph (3) 17 of this Subsection, the provisions of this Subsection will continue to be available 18 19 to the dentist if the Dental HPSA designation is withdrawn after the practice is 20 established at that location."

- 26 "Section 2. The provisions of this Act shall be applicable to tax periods27 beginning on or after January 1, 2020.

Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval."
