COMMENDATIONS: Commends the International Association of Fire Fighters for more than one hundred years of service

A RESOLUTION

2	To commend the International Association of Fire Fighters for more than one hundred years
3	of service.
4	WHEREAS, the International Association of Fire Fighters, or IAFF, was founded in
5	Washington, D.C., on February 26, 1918, when thirty-six delegates representing twenty-four
6	local organizations met at its first convention; and
7	WHEREAS, the IAFF was organized to meet the needs of the emerging professional
8	firefighter; and
9	WHEREAS, at the moment of the IAFF's inception, fire protection services were
0	haphazard and firefighters were often endangered by the lack of safety equipment and
1	operational standards and usually received little or no compensation; and
12	WHEREAS, before the organization existed, a firefighter would often work twenty-
13	four hour shifts in which he was expected to be on continuous duty and would receive very
14	low wages for his services; and
15	WHEREAS, as a corrective to this state of affairs, the IAFF helped to improve
16	working conditions for firefighters and assisted in the process by which firefighters received
17	substantial benefits and better wages; and
18	WHEREAS, the IAFF created the Fire Fighters Fund to provide financial assistance
19	to the children of fallen firefighters; and
20	WHEREAS, during the Great Depression of the 1930s, fire fighting became a more
21	dependable form of employment, and the profession benefitted from improvements in safety

1 technology, including two-way radio communications, breathing equipment, and lifesaving 2 devices; and 3 WHEREAS, in 1934, the IAFF was recognized by the National Fire Protection 4 Association, the United States Department of Agriculture, and other national organizations 5 for its crucial role in the reduction of fire hazards, in the education of the public, and in fire 6 safety research; and 7 WHEREAS, when the United States entered into World War II, IAFF firefighters 8 answered the call to military service in all branches of the armed forces; and 9 WHEREAS, in the December 1941 issue of Fire Fighter magazine, the IAFF 10 declared to its members that "The firefighters of the Nation, in particular, have a distinct 11 service to perform. Already well-organized, trained, and accustomed to discipline and the 12 orderly performance of their duties under any and all conditions, and with complete 13 disregard of any personal danger, firefighters may be expected to set an example for their 14 fellow citizens in the trying days that lie ahead"; and 15 WHEREAS, during World War II, the IAFF assisted in the coordination of its 16 members to ensure that firefighters were available to serve both at home and in combat, and 17 when firefighters returned home after their tours of duty, the IAFF worked to ensure that 18 able-bodied members would return to their firehouses to continue their employment and that 19 disabled firefighters would find positions in the fire service; and 20 WHEREAS, as Emergency Medical Services, or EMS, developed in the 1960s, the 21 IAFF supported the partnership between the EMS and fire protection; and 22 WHEREAS, today, the Fire & EMS Operations/GIS Department of the IAFF 23 provides comprehensive information on fire departments and fire-based EMS and promotes 24 staffing and deployment for fire suppression and fire-based EMS; and 25 WHEREAS, after the 9/11 tragedy at the New York Trade Center, the IAFF stepped 26 in to provide logistical support at Ground Zero, and sent stress management teams to aid 27 overwhelmed firefighters and grieving families, in addition to distributing \$96 million to

family members of fallen firefighters in 2002; and

1 WHEREAS, after 9/11, the leadership of the IAFF participated in the creation of the 2 United States Department of Homeland Security to ensure that fire protection was a priority 3 of the agency; and 4 WHEREAS, the firefighters of the IAFF are always included in the front lines of the 5 response to any national emergency, whether it be hurricanes or other natural disasters or 6 manmade ones, and they contribute time and resources to international relief efforts that 7 better the lives of children and families; and 8 WHEREAS, as the primary advocate for firefighters and paramedics, the IAFF 9 insists that fire personnel be properly equipped to effectively perform their duties, which 10 include ensuring the safety and protection of the nation's citizens; and 11 WHEREAS, the IAFF has been the leader in the advancement of fire safety services 12 throughout the nation, and it has led the way in the attempt to improve the working 13 conditions and compensation of those who step in harm's way to provide fire protection and 14 EMS to the community. 15 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the 16 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby commend the International Association of Fire Fighters 17 for more than one hundred years of service and does hereby congratulate the brave men and 18 women of the firefighting profession for their manifold contributions to the state of 19 Louisiana. 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted 21 to Harold A. Schaitberger, IAFF General President; Edward Kelly, IAFF General Secretary-22 Treasurer; Danny Todd, IAFF Fourteenth District Vice President; and Chad Major, 23 Louisiana President of the IAFF.
