2	To posthumously commend James Puckette Carter, MD for his historic contributions in the
3	fields of medicine and nutrition.
4	WHEREAS, Dr. James Puckette "Jim" Carter was born on October 7, 1933, in
5	Chicago, Illinois, to Ruth Puckette Carter and Dr. Morris Carter; and
6	WHEREAS, after growing up in Chicago with his sister Ruth Carter, Dr. Carter
7	studied and received a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry from the College of Liberal Arts,
8	Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois, in 1954; and
9	WHEREAS, Dr. Carter received his Doctor of Medicine degree from Northwestern
10	University in 1954, and subsequently received a Master of Science in Parasitology from
11	Columbia University School of Public Health and Administrative Medicine in 1963, a
12	Doctoral Degree in Nutrition from Columbia University School of Public Health and
13	Administrative Medicine in 1966, and studied Zen meditation practice and Tai Chi at Loyola
14	University, New Orleans in 1988; and
15	WHEREAS, Dr. Carter served his country for two years, 1966 and 1967, with the
16	United States Navy as a research associate with the United States Naval Medical Research
17	Unit in Cairo, Egypt; and
18	WHEREAS, from 1967 to 1976, Dr. Carter served on the Vanderbilt University

2	and associate professor of pediatrics, being the first African-American faculty member in
3	the Department of Pediatrics and the first full-time African-American faculty member; and
4	WHEREAS, while at Meharry Medical College and Vanderbilt University in 1968,
5	Dr. Carter was one of only forty-four recipients in the Western Hemisphere to be awarded
6	a prestigious five-year faculty fellowship by the Milbank Memorial Fund to obtain additional
7	training and develop his professional career as a medical educator in the specialties of
8	nutrition, tropical medicine, pediatrics, and related fields of study in social and preventive
9	medicine; and
10	WHEREAS, from 1972 to 1976 Dr. Carter led the Maternal and Child Health, Family
11	Planning Training and Research Center at the Meharry Medical College, in Nashville,
12	Tennessee, which successfully trained countless students and health professionals from
13	developing countries in Africa; and
14	WHEREAS, in 1976 Dr. Carter became professor and head of nutrition at the Tulane
15	University School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine in New Orleans, Louisiana, where
16	he also served as a clinical professor of pediatrics; and
17	WHEREAS, Dr. Carter also served as the chairman of the National Advisory
18	Committee, Meharry Medical College's General Foods Nutrition Center, as a consultant in
19	International Nutrition to the United States Agency for International Development, and as
20	a nutrition consultant for the World Health Organization; and
21	WHEREAS, Dr. Carter consulted and was a guest lecturer internationally on health
22	promotion, disease prevention, lifestyles, clinical preventive medicine, alternative medicine,
23	and holistic health; and
24	WHEREAS, Dr. Carter was a published author of the controversial book,
25	Racketeering in Medicine: The Suppression of Alternatives, which was published by
26	Hampton Roads in 1992, and was an investigator in the National Institutes of
27	Health - sponsored Trial to Access Chelation Therapy, presenting his findings to the
28	American Heart Association in Los Angeles in 2012; and
29	WHEREAS, on August 29, 2005, Dr. Carter's home and office were destroyed by the
30	devastating floods and fires caused by Hurricane Katrina; and

WHEREAS, as the city of New Orleans grieved over the aftermath of Hurricane atrina, Dr. Carter never wavered from his lifelong commitment to improving the health of e people of the world and quickly resumed his practice of office-based integrative

medicine as Medical Director of Complementary Medical Services in Mandeville,

Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Carter served as Professor Emeritus at the Tulane School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine and continued with multiple investigative, research, clinical trial, and consulting efforts, in addition to his private clinic work until his death on February 12, 2014; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his inextricable accomplishments in the field of medicine, upon his death Dr. Carter was remembered first and foremost as the devoted and beloved husband of Carolyn Harris-Carter, loving father of James Jr., Rebecca, and Geoffrey and his wife Sarah Carter, and cherished grandfather of Evan, Elias, and Casey Carter; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Carter was profoundly intelligent, but was equally regarded as a gentle, kindhearted man who loved those he served and was equally loved by everyone who knew him; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Carter spoke Spanish, Portuguese, and was most fluent in French, languages he put to use in meeting people around the world, as he enjoyed traveling and had visited many cities for both his work on matters of international health and for leisure; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Carter loved spending time with his family and friends, dancing, and listening to Brazilian jazz; and

WHEREAS, while Dr. Carter has been missed dearly by his family and all of his many friends, colleagues, patients, and former students, and it is with profound respect and adoration that his many groundbreaking social and medicinal accomplishments be recognized and commended posthumously as a way to respect his legacy and encourage and motivate others to strive for fulfillment of a passion to make the world a better place as Dr. Carter so successfully did in life.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby posthumously commend James Puckette Carter, MD for his historic contributions in the fields of medicine and nutrition.
