<u>Existing law</u> provides for criminal history checks on nonlicensed and licensed persons and licensed ambulance personnel.

<u>Existing law</u> defines certain terms relative to the use of criminal history checks on certain individuals. <u>Prior law</u> defined the term "employer". <u>New law</u> adds free-standing birth centers to the list of enumerated employers.

<u>Existing law</u> provides for the fees, licensing, and penalties of any legal entity currently operating or planning to operate any of the facilities listed within <u>existing law</u>. <u>New law</u> makes existing law applicable to "free-standing birth centers".

<u>New law</u> authorizes the Louisiana Department of Health (LDH) to promulgate and publish rules and regulations for the licensing of free-standing birth centers.

<u>New law</u> defines certain terms including "free standing birth center", "free-standing birth center services", "low-risk pregnancy", and "standards".

<u>New law</u> requires that free-standing birth centers be licensed by LDH and that no such center be established, operated, or reimbursed under the Medicaid program unless licensed to provide such services as a free-standing birth center by LDH.

<u>New law</u> provides for specific requirements of licenses of free-standing birth centers such as specific geographic location, the term and expiration date, the form of such license, and the location of posting such license.

<u>New law</u> provides that the rules and regulations promulgated by LDH shall be in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act; provides that such rules shall be in the interest of the health, safety, welfare, and well being of persons receiving services from free standing birthing centers; and provides that such rules are effective upon approval by the secretary of LDH and shall have the effect of law.

<u>New law</u> provides for the process, including the payment of a licensing fee as provided in <u>existing law</u>, an applicant must follow to apply to be licensed as a free-standing birth center by LDH. New law provides for the procedure for the renewal of a license.

<u>New law</u> provides for the penalties of any entity operating as a free-standing birth center without a license from LDH. <u>New law</u> provides that any center or facility operating without a license shall be charged with a misdemeanor. <u>New law</u> provides for the issuance of a fine between \$250 and \$1,000 upon conviction.

<u>New law</u> provides that any licensed free-standing birth center is subject to inspection of records and reports by LDH.
