CIVIL/PROCEDURE: Provides relative to the signing of civil pleadings

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact Code of Civil Procedure Article 863(A), relative to the signing of
3	civil pleadings; to provide for a physical service address; and to provide for related
4	matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. Code of Civil Procedure Article 863(A) is hereby amended and reenacted
7	to read as follows:
8	Art. 863. Signing of pleadings, effect
9	A. Every pleading of a party represented by an attorney shall be signed by
10	at least one attorney of record in his individual name, whose physical address for
11	service of process shall be stated. A party who is not represented by an attorney
12	shall sign his pleading and state his <u>physical</u> address <u>for service of process</u> . <u>If mail</u>
13	is not received at the physical address for service of process, a designated mailing
14	address shall also be provided.

Abstract: Requires a physical service address when signing the pleading.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the party signing the pleading state an address.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the address requirement to be a physical service address.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for a designated mailing address, if different from the physical service address.
