COLLEGES/UNIVERSITIES. Requires each full-time university or college police officer to carry a supply of opiate antagonists nasal spray in his official vehicle. (gov sig)

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:3351(C)(1) and the introductory paragraph of (C)(2) and (3)
3	and to enact R.S. 17:1805(I) and 3351(C)(3)(i), relative to authority of university or
4	college police officers to maintain and administer opiate antagonist nasal sprays; to
5	require each postsecondary education management board and each postsecondary
6	institution to develop policies governing the supply and administration of opiate
7	antagonist nasal sprays; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 17:3351(C)(1) and the introductory paragraph of (C)(2) and (3) are
10	hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 17:1805(I) and 3351(C)(3)(i) are hereby enacted to
11	read as follows:
12	§1805. Authority of university or college police officer
13	* * *
14	I. Each full-time university or college police officer shall maintain a
15	supply of an opiate antagonist in a nasal spray formulation within his official
16	vehicle. The maintenance and use of the opiate antagonist shall be in compliance
17	with the policy adopted by the employing postsecondary education institution

1	pursuant to R.S. 17:3351(C)(3).

3	§3351. General powers, duties, and functions of postsecondary education
4	management boards
5	* * *
6	C.(1) In addition to any other powers and duties authorized by this Section,
7	each board shall adopt, by not later than January 1, 1990, a:
8	(1) A policy requiring each institution under the supervision and management
9	of that board to report, on at least a monthly basis, the numbers and types of reported
10	criminal offenses occurring on property owned or under the control of the institution.
11	Such report shall be made to the appropriate management board and shall be a public
12	record. The form and content of such reports shall be prescribed by the management
13	board but shall be such as to be acceptable for the purposes of compiling uniform
14	crime reports. The report provided for by this Subsection shall be limited to those
15	offenses included in Part I of the most recently published edition of the Uniform
16	Crime Reports for the United States as printed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation
17	and the United States Department of Justice.
18	(2) The $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ policy also shall require $\underline{\mathbf{requiring}}$ each institution to publish in
19	its catalog basic information about security procedures and practices maintained by
20	the institution. Such information, to the extent not otherwise exempt by law from
21	disclosure, shall include but need not be limited to the following:

23	(3) The policy also shall require each institution to develop and adopt written
24	Written security rules, regulations, and procedures. Such rules, regulations, and
25	procedures shall include but need not be limited to the following information:
26	* * *
27	(i) Rules and regulations governing the administration of opiate
28	antagonists that:
29	(aa) Comply with the provisions of R.S. 14:403.11 and R.S. 40:978.1.

1	(bb) Require each official vehicle operated by a full-time university or
2	college police officer to be equipped with a supply of an opiate antagonist in a
3	nasal spray formulation.
4	(cc) Require a report of each incident during which a full-time university
5	or college police officer administers an opiate antagonist.

7	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
8	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
9	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
10	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
11	effective on the day following such approval.

SB 51 Original

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Present law (R.S. 17:1805) provides for the authority of university or college police officers and requires each postsecondary education management board to require each institution to develop and adopt written security rules, regulations, and procedures.

Present law (R.S. 14:403.11 and 40:978.1) provides for the prescribing of and administration of opiate antagonists by first responders and law enforcement officials. Present law provides for certain training prior to administration, immunity from liability for administration of opiate antagonists. Additionally requires best practices to be established regarding training, administration, and follow-up for procedures for opiate antagonists.

Proposed law retains present law and additionally requires each full-time university or college police officer to maintain a supply of opiate antagonist in a nasal spray formulation in his official vehicle.

Proposed law provides that each postsecondary education management board shall require each institution under its jurisdiction to establish written security rules, regulations, and procedures governing the use of opiate antagonists that:

- (1) Complies with the provisions of present law.
- Requires each official vehicle operated by a full-time university or college police (2) officer to be equipped with a supply of an opiate antagonist in a nasal spray formulation.
- Requires a report of each incident during which a full-time university or college (3) police officer administers an opiate antagonist.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

(Amends R.S. 17:3351(C)(1) and (C)(2)(intro para) and (3)(intro para); adds R.S. 17:1805(I) and 17:3351(C)(3)(i))
