<u>Proposed law</u> provides that no person shall store more than 20 whole waste tires or sell tires without holding a valid generator identification number issued by the DEQ.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that no person that stores more than 20 whole waste tires or sells tires shall allow the waste tires generated by his activities be transported by a person without a valid transporter authorization certificate and a manifest satisfying the requirements of the DEQ.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that any person who willfully or knowingly violates <u>proposed law</u> shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not less than \$300 but not more than \$500, or imprisonment for six months, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that no person can transport more than 20 waste tires without a valid transporter authorization certificate and a manifest satisfying the requirements of the DEQ.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a transporter of waste tires to only accept and transport waste tires from a person who has obtained a valid generator identification number from the DEQ.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that any person who willfully or knowingly violates <u>proposed law</u> shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not less than \$300 but not more than \$500, or imprisonment for six months, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires promulgation of any DEQ rules and regulations pursuant to <u>proposed law</u> be in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.
