PROPERTY/UNCLAIMED: Provides relative to requirements for reporting and advertising unclaimed property

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 9:159(B)(1) through (3) and 161(B), relative to unclaimed
3	property; to revise reporting thresholds for abandoned property; to revise the
4	minimum value beneath which unclaimed property need not be advertised; and to
5	provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 9:159(B)(1) through (3) and 161(B) are hereby amended and
8	reenacted to read as follows:
9	§159. Report of abandoned property
10	* * *
11	B. The report shall be verified and shall include all of the following:
12	(1) Except with respect to a traveler's check or money order, the name if
13	known, and last known address, if any, and the social security number or taxpayer
14	identification number, if readily ascertainable, of the apparent owner of property of
15	the value of fifty ten dollars or more.
16	(2) An aggregated amount of items valued under fifty ten dollars each.
17	(3) In the case of unclaimed money amounting to fifty ten dollars or more
18	held or owing under any annuity or life or endowment insurance policy the full name
19	and last known address of the insured or annuitant and of the beneficiary.

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\$161. Notice and publication of lists of abandoned property

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B. The administrator is not required to advertise the name and address or

location of an owner of property having a total value less than fifty one hundred

dollars, or information concerning a traveler's check, money order, or similar written

instrument.

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Garofalo

Abstract: Lowers the value threshold for reporting abandoned property to the state treasurer <u>from</u> \$50 to \$10 and for advertising unclaimed property <u>from</u> \$50 to \$100.

<u>Present law</u> provides a mechanism for businesses to transfer abandoned property to the state treasurer. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 9:159) requires abandoned property to be reported when it has a value of \$50 or more. <u>Proposed law</u> lowers this to a value of \$10 or more.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 9:161) requires the treasurer, as administrator of unclaimed property, to advertise the name and address or location of an owner of unclaimed property having a total value greater than \$50. <u>Proposed law</u> raises the threshold <u>from</u> \$50 <u>to</u> \$100.

(Amends R.S. 9:159(B)(1)-(3) and 161(B))

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Appropriations</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

1. Remove provision in <u>proposed law</u> that would have required holders of presumed abandoned property with a value of \$10 or more to attempt to notify the owner.
