5 States, the National Basketball Association suspended all games for thirty days; and

6 WHEREAS, Zion Williamson, power forward for the New Orleans Pelicans, pledged
7 to cover the cost of Smoothie King Center employee salaries for thirty days; and

8 WHEREAS, the Pelicans were scheduled to play seven home games during that time
9 and as a result of Mr. Williamson's generosity, the employees were compensated even
10 though the games did not take place; and

11 WHEREAS, Zion Williamson merits the highest commendation for his generosity
12 and support of the employees of the Smoothie King Center during the COVID-19 global
13 pandemic and health crisis; and

14 WHEREAS, the success of the state of Louisiana, the strength of its communities,
15 and the overall vitality of American society depend in great measure upon people like Zion
