<u>Present law</u> allows the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness to establish credentials and requirements for volunteers.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and sets all of the following qualifications for volunteers for cyber response and recovery efforts:

- (1) Be 18 years of age or older.
- (2) Be a resident of the state.
- (3) Have no criminal convictions or arrests aside from minor traffic violations.
- (4) Not be identified on any national criminal registry, including, but not limited, the National Sex Offender Registry.
- (5) Have a verifiable educational or professional background in information technology services or information security and assurance.
