

HOUSE SUMMARY OF SENATE AMENDMENTS**HB 316****2021 Regular Session****Davis**

CHILDREN/NEWBORNS: Adds mucopolysaccharidosis type I, glycogen storage disorder type II, and Krabbe disease to the state's newborn screening panel

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

1. Remove Krabbe disease from the list of genetic conditions for which physicians attending newborn children shall test.
2. Make technical changes.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

Present law provides that a physician attending to the care of a newborn child shall cause the child to be subjected to a list of genetic conditions provided for in present law that have been approved by the La. Dept. of Health. Further provides that the genetic conditions shall be tested upon approval by the newborn child's parents.

Proposed law retains present law and adds that of the genetic conditions provided by present law, MPS I and Pompe diseases shall be genetic conditions approved by the La. Dept. of Health and shall be tested by physicians attending newborn children, upon the approval by the child's parents.

Proposed law supersedes amendments to present law, R.S. 40:1081.2(A)(1), made by §1 of Act No. 507 of the 2016 Regular Session.

Effective Jan. 1, 2022.
