**Abstract:** To limit tax assessors to no more than two and one-half terms in three consecutive terms in office.

Present constitution provides that each parish shall elect a tax assessor.

<u>Present constitution</u> further provides that the term of an elected tax assessor shall be four years.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> prohibits a person who has served as a tax assessor for more than two and one-half terms in three consecutive terms from being elected assessor for the succeeding term.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> further provides that <u>proposed constitution</u> applies to terms of service that begin after the effective date of proposed constitution.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held Nov. 8, 2022.
