Womack

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 38:2211) requires any public entity advertising for public work to use only the Louisiana Uniform Bid Form and specifically provides for the required information and documentation to be submitted by a bidder.

Proposed law retains present law.

SB 271 Original

<u>Proposed law</u> voids any additional requirements for information requested by a public entity and prohibits the additional requirements from being considered in the award of the contract.

<u>Present law</u> requires all bidders' information on public bids to be made available upon request, either no sooner than fourteen days following the bid opening or after the recommendation of award by the public entity or the design professional, whichever occurs first, with the requester responsible for payment of reasonable reproduction costs.

<u>Proposed law</u> shortens the request time <u>from</u> no sooner than fourteen days <u>to</u> no sooner than seven days following the bid opening and otherwise retains <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "working days" as the days Monday through Friday, excluding recognized holidays.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
