**Abstract:** Provides relative to notification given by hospitals to law enforcement agencies.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a hospital shall notify the appropriate arresting or investigating law enforcement agency that a doctor has ordered the discharge of a patient from the hospital as soon as reasonably possible after the order has been written, if all of the following conditions exist:

- (1) The law enforcement agency has certified in writing that the patient has been issued a summons or arrest warrant for an offense, but as a result of the need for emergency medical care, the warrant has not been executed prior to admission to the hospital.
- (2) The law enforcement agency has provided the hospital with a written request to be informed upon the discharge of the patient from the hospital.
- (3) The law enforcement agency has provided contact information for use by the hospital in making the notification.

<u>Present law</u> provides that no hospital shall be held civilly liable to any person for failure to comply or to timely comply with the requirements of <u>present law</u> unless that failure is intentional or due to gross negligence.

Present law provides for the definition of "hospital".

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that as used in <u>proposed law</u> an "appropriate arresting or investigating law enforcement agency" shall include a bail enforcement agent as defined in <u>present law</u> (C.Cr.P. Art. 311(8)(A)).
