2	To recognize Wednesday, April 6, 2022, as Coastal Conservation Association Day at the
3	Louisiana State Capitol.
4	WHEREAS, the Coastal Conservation Association, widely known as the CCA, was
5	founded in 1983 in Louisiana by a small group of concerned coastal anglers to preserve and
6	protect Louisiana's coastal resources; and
7	WHEREAS, the CCA is a grass-roots nonprofit organization, comprised of roughly
8	twenty-five thousand members and volunteers from all sixty-four Louisiana parishes, in
9	thirty local chapters; and
10	WHEREAS, coastal angling is a way of life in Louisiana, enjoyed by hundreds of
11	thousands of men, women, and children each year, generating billions in economic impact,
12	and tens of thousands of jobs; and
13	WHEREAS, the CCA has been instrumental in every significant coastal fisheries
14	management issue in Louisiana since 1983, including advocating for improvements to the
15	management of redfish, speckled trout, drum, flounder, tarpon, red snapper, tuna, cobia,
16	shrimp, oysters, crabs, menhaden, and many more; and
17	WHEREAS, the CCA, along with the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and other
18	conservation partners, has built thirty-five artificial reefs across Louisiana, providing habitat,

1	for a large variety of iconic coastal species; and
2	WHEREAS, the CCA hosts the annual STAR tournament, the largest saltwater
3	fishing tournament in Louisiana, which runs from Memorial Day to Labor Day, and
4	welcomes more than ten thousand participants annually; and
5	WHEREAS, the CCA provides education and outreach to tens of thousands of
6	Louisianians each year, including thousands of children through school and youth group
7	presentations, where a message of coastal stewardship and conservation is delivered; and
8	WHEREAS, the CCA hosts TAG Louisiana, one of the nation's most prolific and
9	longest-running scientific fish tagging programs; and
10	WHEREAS, for more than three decades, volunteer "citizen scientists" have tagged
11	and released more than one half million saltwater fish that provides biological data to fishery
12	managers in Louisiana and across the Gulf; and
13	WHEREAS, the CCA Louisiana hosts the annual Legislators' Fishing Rodeo in
14	Grand Isle, aimed at informing Louisiana leaders about the issues that impact our coastal
15	resources and the recreational fishing industry that will continue with the 2022 Legislators'
16	Rodeo to be held on August 5th and 6th in Grand Isle.
17	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
18	does hereby recognize Wednesday, April 6, 2022, as Coastal Conservation Association Day
19	at the Louisiana State Capitol and does hereby express its appreciation to all of the CCA
20	chapters and members who volunteer their time and talents to ensure the well-being of
21	Louisiana's marine resources.
