§850. Facsimile transmission; filings in civil actions; fees; equipment and supplies

Abstract: Provides for electronic filing acceptance at the time filing was received.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 13:850) provides that any document in a civil action may be filed with the clerk of court by facsimile transmission and that filing is deemed complete at the time the facsimile transmission is received by the clerk of court.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes <u>present law</u> to provide that the equipment used to accept facsimile filings cannot be intentionally turned off or disconnected, and that filing shall be deemed complete on the date and time indicated on the clerk of court facsimile transmission receipt.
