SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 38

BY SENATOR TALBOT

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HEALTH CARE. Requests the Louisiana Department of Health to study programs implemented in other states or through Medicaid waiver programs to evaluate options for delaying institutionalization for frail elders.

A RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health to study programs implemented in
3	other states or through Medicaid waiver programs to evaluate options for delaying
4	institutionalization for frail elders.
5	WHEREAS, the number of people in Louisiana who are age eighty-five and older
6	and are most likely to require caregiving assistance is projected to surpass one hundred
7	twenty-six thousand by the year 2030; and
8	WHEREAS, the majority of elders who are in need of assistance with activities of
9	daily living prefer to remain in their own homes and communities as they age; and
10	WHEREAS, to successfully accommodate the surging population of elders who have
11	significant healthcare needs, this state must implement policies to encourage and support
12	families in assisting their aging relatives and institute best practices for recruiting and
13	retaining a qualified, responsive, in-home care workforce; and
14	WHEREAS, Louisiana treasures its elders, as they are the living heritage of our
15	families and our rich and wonderful culture; and
16	WHEREAS, ensuring the safety and well-being of our elders is a critical public
17	policy priority of this state; and
18	WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Legislature of Louisiana that frail elders be

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1 provided human services in the least restrictive settings where they may enjoy, for as long 2 as possible, their independence in a home- and community-based setting with a high quality 3 of life before a transition to institutional care is necessary. 4 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana 5 does hereby urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health to study various programs 6 implemented in other states, or through waiver programs approved by the Centers for 7 Medicare and Medicaid Services, for the purpose of evaluating options for home- and 8 community-based services for frail elders to provide them with a sustained quality of life at 9 home and delay the need for nursing home or other institutional placement. 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in conducting the study required by this 11 Resolution, the department shall focus, at a minimum, on answering the following questions: 12 (1) Can a program for frail elders to remain at home with community-based supports 13 delay the need for institutionalization and enhance the quality of life for the individuals who 14 otherwise qualify for nursing home admission? 15 (2) Recognizing the importance of the financial stability of the nursing home industry 16 in Louisiana, is there a model which incentivizes the sharing of savings between the state and the nursing home when a frail elder, who otherwise qualifies for nursing home 17 18 placement, is able to delay admission to a nursing home while receiving community-based 19 supports? 20 (3) What has been the experience of states with a large population of frail elders 21 which have implemented nursing home diversion programs? 22 (4) If the state were to implement a nursing home diversion program, what would the 23 impact be on nursing homes in terms of capacity and volume, and would the moratorium on 24 new nursing home beds help ensure the ongoing financial sustainability for existing nursing 25 homes? (5) Based on the experience of other states, which financial models work best to 26 27 incentivize the delayed use of institutionalization without financial detriment to nursing homes? 28 29 (6) What role will care coordination play in ensuring the success of delaying nursing

home care, and what is the best model for incentivizing accountable and appropriate care

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coordination?

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no later than February 1, 2023, the department shall prepare and submit a written report of its findings and recommendations to the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare, and to the David R. Poynter Legislative Research Library as required by R.S. 24:771 and 772.
