#### A RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, after completing his military service, Huey used the skills he acquired during his Air Force training to start a career in the television and electronics business; he eventually opened his own business, Hebert's TV; and

WHEREAS, Huey was committed to his Southern Baptist faith; he routinely read his Bible and raised his children to love and respect God; he was immensely proud of his faith and held his family to the same standard; and

WHEREAS, Huey Long Hebert leaves to cherish his memory his loving wife of sixty-nine years, Caryl Francis Grant Hebert; his sons, Frank Hebert, and his wife Faye, John Hebert, and his wife Kitty, and Blaine Hebert, and his wife Kirsten; daughter, Grace Hebert
