Abstract: Provides a definition for and makes provisions applicable to long-term care facilities.

<u>Present law</u> creates a program to authorize certification of medication attendants to perform certain functions in licensed nursing homes. <u>Proposed law</u> states that <u>present law</u> shall be made applicable to licensed long-term care providers licensed by the Louisiana Department of Health.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "licensed long-term care facility". <u>Proposed law</u> provides that the term "licensed long-term care facility" encompasses nursing homes and adult residential care providers.

<u>Present law provides</u> for persons who have completed an approved medication administration course, passed a quality certification examination, and been issued a current certification by the department shall be permitted to administer certain prescribed medications to residents of licensed nursing homes. <u>Proposed law</u> states that <u>present law</u> shall be made applicable to licensed long-term care providers licensed by the Louisiana Department of Health.

<u>Present law</u> states that the rules and regulations shall include but not be limited to ratios of supervising licensed nurses to medication attendants in licensed nursing homes. <u>Proposed law</u> states that the rules and regulations shall include but not be limited to ratios of supervising licensed nurses to medication attendants in licensed long-term care facilities.

<u>Present law</u> requires the promulgation of rules and regulations for the enforcement of this Part to be done by March 31, 2008. <u>Proposed law</u> removes deadline for the promulgation of rules and regulations for the enforcement of this Part.

<u>Present law</u> requires each person accepted to participate in the medication administration course to have a minimum of one year's experience in a nursing home as a certified nursing assistant or graduated from a nursing program. <u>Proposed law</u> requires each person accepted to participate in the medication administration course to have a minimum of one year's experience in a licensed long-term care facility as a certified nursing assistant or graduate from a nursing program.

<u>Present law</u> requires any nursing home utilizing a medication attendant to verify with the nurse aide registry that the person has a current certification. <u>Proposed law</u> requires any licensed long-term care facility utilizing a medication attendant to verify with the nurse aide registry that the person has a current certification.
