Abstract: Requires public school students in grades six through 12 to receive training on suicide prevention and student safety and violence and social isolation prevention.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that public school students in grades six through 12 receive training on the following topics:

- (1) Suicide prevention.
- (2) Student safety and violence and social isolation prevention.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires each public school governing authority with jurisdiction over a school with students in grades six through 12 to offer student-led clubs focused on the two topics listed above.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the state Dept. of Education to maintain a list of evidence-based training on the two topics listed above and review such list at least triennially.

Provides such training shall each be:

- (1) Evidence-based.
- (2) The duration of one standard class period or one hour.

<u>Proposed law</u> allows parents to request that their children be excused from the training.

Effective July 1, 2023.

(Amends R.S. 17:282.4(C)(1)(intro. para.) and (c) and 286(A); Adds R.S. 17:282.4(G) and (H))

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Education to the original bill:

1. Change subject of training <u>from</u> student safety, violence prevention, and social inclusion <u>to</u> student safety and violence and social isolation prevention.

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

1. Add special effective date.
