Abstract: To limit tax assessors to no more than two and one-half terms in three consecutive terms in office.

Present constitution provides that each parish shall elect a tax assessor.

<u>Present constitution</u> further provides that the term of an elected tax assessor shall be four years.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> prohibits a person who has served as a tax assessor for more than two and one-half terms in three consecutive terms from being elected assessor for the succeeding term.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> further provides that <u>proposed constitution</u> applies to terms of service that begin after the effective date of <u>proposed constitution</u>.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held Nov. 8, 2022.
