EARLY CHILDHOOD: Provides relative to adverse childhood experiences and traumainformed education

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:437.2(A)(2), (B), (C)(3), and (D) and to enact R.S.
3	17:407.22.1 and 437.2(A)(3) and (E), relative to adverse childhood experience in
4	early childhood education; to provide for definitions; to provide for responsibilities
5	of the state Department of Education; to require the creation of pilot programs; and
6	to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 17:437.2(A)(2), (B), (C)(3), and (D) are hereby amended and
9	reenacted and R.S. 17:407.22.1 and 437.2(A)(3) and (E) are hereby enacted to read as
10	follows:
11	§407.22.1. Adverse childhood experience program; inclusion in early childhood
12	education; pilot program
13	A.(1) The state Department of Education shall create and annually
14	implement pilot programs that integrate adverse childhood experience education as
15	defined in R.S. 17:437.2 into early childhood education.
16	(2) After one year the department shall expand the programs pursuant to
17	Paragraph (1) of this Subsection by integrating adverse childhood experience family
18	outreach as defined in R.S. 17:437.2 into early childhood education.

1	B. The department shall report to the legislature by January thirty-first
2	annually relative to the status, progress, and effects of the programs implemented
3	pursuant to Subsection A of this Section.

5	§437.2. Adverse childhood experiences; trauma-informed experience education; in-
6	service training
7	A. As used in this Section:
8	* * *
9	(2) "Trauma-informed Adverse childhood experience education" means a
10	school-wide approach to education and a classroom-based approach to student
11	learning that recognizes the signs and symptoms of adverse childhood experiences
12	in students, families, and staff and responds by integrating knowledge about trauma-
13	informed adverse childhood experience policies, professional learning, procedures,
14	and practices to address the long-term effects of adverse childhood experiences on
15	a student's cognitive functioning and his physical, social, emotional, and mental
16	well-being.
17	(3) "Adverse childhood experience family outreach" means a school-wide
18	approach to parental or care giver outreach in which the parent or care giver receive
19	access to information about adverse childhood experiences and their effect on early
20	childhood education, and education and resources regarding the manifestations of
21	such experiences in adulthood and the intergenerational nature of such experiences
22	in families.
23	B.(1) The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, after
24	consultation with the Louisiana Department of Health, office of public health, shall
25	develop and adopt guidelines for in-service training in recognizing the signs and
26	symptoms of adverse childhood experiences and the utilization of trauma-informed
27	adverse childhood experience educational practices to address student needs
28	resulting from these experiences.

1	(2) The board shall adopt rules to require that, beginning with the 2021-2022
2	school year, all public and approved nonpublic school teachers, school counselors,
3	principals, and other school administrators for whom the training is considered
4	beneficial by the board shall annually participate in at least one hour of in-service
5	training on recognizing adverse childhood experiences and the utilization of trauma-
6	informed adverse childhood experience education. The in-service training required
7	by this Paragraph shall be provided on a day that other types of in-service training
8	will be provided in accordance with the school calendar adopted by each public
9	school governing authority.
10	C. The training shall include research-based information regarding the
11	following:

13	(3) Best practices for schools and classrooms regarding trauma-informed
14	approaches to adverse childhood experience considerations in education.

16	D. The state Department of Education shall report to the legislature by
17	January thirty-first annually relative to efforts to integrate adverse childhood
18	experience educational practices into schools.
19	\underline{E} . The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education shall adopt rules
20	in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act to implement the provisions
21	of this Section.
22	Section 2. The Department of Education shall begin implementing R.S. 17:407.22.1
23	as enacted by this Act in fiscal year 2022-2023.

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Abstract: Requires the integration of adverse childhood experience educational practices into early childhood education.

Adverse childhood experience family outreach

<u>Present law</u> defines "adverse childhood experiences" and "trauma-informed education" in the context of school employees and best practices for schools and classrooms. <u>Proposed law</u> changes term "trauma-informed education" to "adverse childhood experience education" and adds "adverse childhood education family outreach" to the definitions. Further requires the state Dept. of Education (DOE) to annually report relative to efforts to integrate such concepts and practices into schools.

Pilot programs

<u>Proposed law</u> requires DOE to create and implement pilot programs integrating adverse childhood experience education and adverse childhood experience family outreach into early childhood education. Further requires DOE to annually report relative to the implementation of the programs.

(Amends R.S. 17:437.2(A)(2), (B), (C)(3), and (D); Adds R.S. 17:407.22.1 and 437.2(A)(3) and (E))

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

- The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Education</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:
- 1. Delete requirements relative to monies from the La. Early Childhood Education Fund being used for proposed law purposes.
- 2. Remove references to "trauma-informed" education from <u>present law</u> and <u>proposed law</u>. Change all references to "trauma-informed" education and outreach to "adverse childhood experience" education and outreach.
