CRIMINAL/VICTIMS EG DECREASE SG RV See Note Provides relative to rights of victims of criminal offenses

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<u>Proposed legislation</u> provides that a victim (or designated family member) has rights and is eligible for services regardless of when the victim reported the crime to law enforcement authorities. Removes the requirement that a victim register with the clerk of court, law enforcement, or judicial entity. Provides the victim may complete a form to be filed with the appropriate law enforcement agency to be sent to the district attorney's office. Provides that the redaction of a victim's name is not necessary when the named victim is the one requesting the records. Provides all victims of violent crime shall have the right to access and obtain a copy of their police report at no cost to them. Provides a victim of sexual assault shall have the right to a forensic medical exam. Provides all victims of sexual assault shall have the right to access and obtain a copy of their forensic medical examination report at no cost to them. Repeals R.S. 46:1845(C) and(D). The proposed law shall take effect if and when SB 147 of the 2022 Regular Session is enacted.

## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. There will be a negligible cost to State Police and/or local enforcement entities as a result of the proposed law granting victims of violent crime the right to obtain a copy of their police report at no cost.

There is no fiscal impact to medical providers as a result of the proposed law granting victims of sexual assault the right to a forensic medical exam. The Crime Victims Reparations Board currently reimburses medical providers for these types of exams.

## **REVENUE EXPLANATION**

There will be an indeterminable but likely minimal decrease in revenue to the State Police and/or local law enforcement entities as a result of the proposed law granting victims of violent crime the right to obtain a copy of their police report at no cost. Police departments, on average, charge \$7.00 for a police report. The loss of this self-generated revenue will be negligible and will not impact operations of law enforcement entities.
