HIGHER EDUCATION: Provides relative to tuition for certain nonresident postsecondary students

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 17:3383, relative to colleges and universities; to provide relative to tuition
3 charged to certain nonresident students at postsecondary education institutions; and
4 to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 17:3383 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

7 §3383. Children of graduates; tuition and fee waiver

8 A. Each four-year public postsecondary education institution in Louisiana,
9 except institutions under the supervision and management of the Board of
10 Supervisors of Louisiana State University and Agricultural Mechanical College, shall
11 classify every student who is the child of a graduate of any four-year public
12 postsecondary education institution in Louisiana as a resident student for purposes
13 of determining the tuition and mandatory fee amounts that the institution charges the
14 student.

15 B. Nothing in this Section shall have any effect on the eligibility
16 requirements for the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students as provided in
17 Chapter 50 of this Title.

Abstract: Provides relative to tuition for nonresident students at postsecondary education institutions who are children of graduates from such institutions.

Present law provides for the powers and duties of public postsecondary education management boards, including but not limited to the authority to establish tuition and mandatory attendance fee amounts applicable to nonresident students attending institutions under their jurisdiction.

Proposed law retains present law.

Proposed law requires nonresident students at public four-year postsecondary education institutions in La. who are children of graduates of such institutions to be considered resident students for purposes of determining tuition and mandatory fee amounts. Proposed law is not applicable to institutions under the La. State University board of supervisors.

1. Limit applicability of proposed law by excluding private institutions and institutions under the LSU board of supervisors.
