2	To amend and reenact R.S. 47:1907(K), relative to assessors; to authorize assessors to
3	increase their compensation up to five percent for four calendar years; to provide for
4	an effective date; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 47:1907(K) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
7	§1907. Salaries
8	* * *
9	K. In addition to all other forms of compensation which are authorized for
10	assessors under the provisions of this Section, each assessor's office may increase the
11	assessor's annual compensation by up to four five percent each calendar year for four
12	calendar years, beginning calendar year $\frac{2013}{2022}$ and ending calendar year $\frac{2016}{2016}$
13	<u>2025</u> .
14	Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2022; if vetoed by the governor
15	and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day
16	following such approval by the legislature or July 1, 2022, whichever is later.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes each assessor's office to increase the assessor's annual compensation by up to four percent each calendar year for four calendar years, which began in calendar year 2013 and ended in calendar year 2016.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> authorization and changes the annual compensation of assessors <u>from</u> up to four percent to up to five percent each calendar year for four calendar years, which begins in 2022 and ends in 2025.

Effective July 1, 2022.
