HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 186

A RESOLUTION

To commend the Louisiana Youth for Health Justice Council on being advocates for reproductive, social, and racial justice.

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Youth for Health Justice Council is a program of the Institute of Women and Ethnic Studies; it consists of nine young advocates for sex education and reproductive health care; and

WHEREAS, these nine advocates have created lessons on consent and hypersexualization for other young people as well as learned advocacy, lobbying, and organizing skills; and

WHEREAS, Louisiana Youth for Health Justice Council is devoted to improving access to sexual health information and supplies such as condoms and menstrual products for young people across Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, the Institute of Women and Ethnic Studies received funding from the Packard Foundation to deepen and build upon past and existing efforts to create an environment favorable to comprehensive sexuality education and continue to expand the number of youth in Louisiana who have access to medically accurate, age and developmentally appropriate, gender-transformative, and trauma-responsive sexuality education and resources that promote reproductive justice; and
