<u>Existing law</u> requires a license to engage in the practice of massage therapy. <u>Existing law</u> provides the required qualifications for licensure by the La. Board of Massage Therapy (board) and the methods for issuance of licenses to qualified applicants.

<u>New law</u> authorizes a three-month provisional license for massage therapy graduates. <u>New law</u> does not allow for a renewal of the provisional license.

<u>New law</u> requires a facility that employs a provisionally licensed massage therapist to notify a customer that the massage therapist is operating under a provisional license prior to the consumer receiving services from that massage therapist.

<u>New law</u> provides that a provisionally licensed massage therapist may only work at a facility that employs a massage therapist licensed pursuant to <u>existing law</u>.

New law shall cease to be effective on Dec. 31, 2025.
