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1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 2, delete lines 26 through 29 and delete pages 3 and 4 and on page 5, delete lines  
3 1 through 5 and insert the following:

4 "§5025.6 High school core curriculum requirements; Opportunity,  
5 Performance, and Honors Awards; students graduating in the 2026-2027 school year  
6 To be eligible for an Opportunity, Performance, or Honors Award pursuant  
7 to this Chapter, a student who graduated from high school during the 2026-2027  
8 school year shall have successfully completed a core curriculum which consists of  
9 nineteen units of high school course work as follows:

10 (1) English - Four Units

11 (a) English I.

12 (b) English II.

13 (c) One unit chosen from the following: English III, AP English Language  
14 Arts and Composition, or English III IB (Language A or Literature and  
15 Performance).

16 (d) One unit chosen from the following: English IV, AP English Literature  
17 and Composition, or English IV IB (Language A or Literature and  
18 Performance).

19 (2) Mathematics - Four Units

20 (a) Algebra I (one unit), Geometry (one unit), and Algebra II (one unit).  
21 Integrated Mathematics I, Integrated Mathematics II, and Integrated Mathematics III  
22 may be substituted for the Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II sequence.

23 (b) One unit chosen from the following: Algebra III; Advanced Math  
24 Functions and Statistics, Advanced Math-Pre-Calculus, Pre-Calculus, or Math  
25 Methods I IB (Mathematical Studies SL); Calculus, AP Calculus AB, or Math  
26 Methods II IB (Mathematics SL); AP Calculus BC; Probability and Statistics or AP  
27 Statistics; IB Further Mathematics HL; IB Mathematics HL.

28 (3) Science - Four Units

29 (a) Biology I.

30 (b) Chemistry I.

31 (c) Two units chosen from the following: Earth Science; Environmental  
32 Science; Physical Science; Agriscience I and Agriscience II (one unit combined);  
33 Chemistry II, AP Chemistry, or IB Chemistry II; AP Environmental Science, or IB  
34 Environmental Systems; Physics I, AP Physics I, AP Physics B, or IB Physics I; AP  
35 Physics C: Electricity and Magnetism, AP Physics C: Mechanics, IB Physics II, or  
36 AP Physics II; Biology II, AP Biology, or IB Biology II.

37 (4) Social Studies - Four Units

38 (a) One unit chosen from the following: U.S. History, AP US History, or IB  
39 US History.

40 (b) One unit chosen from the following: Civics, Government, AP US  
41 Government and Politics: Comparative, AP US Government and Politics: United  
42 States.

43 (c) Two units chosen from the following: Western Civilization, European  
44 History, or AP European History; World Geography, AP Human Geography, or IB  
45 Geography; World History, AP World History, or World History IB; History of  
46 Religion; IB Economics, Economics, AP Macroeconomics, or AP Microeconomics;  
47 African American History.

48 (5) Foreign Language or Computer Science - Two Units

49 (a) Foreign Language - the two units shall be in the same language, which  
50 may include the following: AP Chinese Language and Culture, AP French Language

1 and Culture, AP German Language and Culture, AP Italian Language and Culture,  
2 AP Japanese Language and Culture, AP Latin, AP Spanish Language and Culture,  
3 French IV IB, French V IB, Spanish IV IB, and Spanish V IB.

4 (b) Computer Science - the two units shall be in principles, coding, and  
5 programming, which may include the following: Computer Science I, Computer  
6 Science II, Fundamentals of HTML, CSS, and JavaScript (Level 1), Advanced  
7 JavaScript, Functional Programming, and Web Development (Level 2), AP  
8 Computer Science A, AP Computer Science Principles, Computer Science Year One  
9 IB, and Computer Science Year Two IB.

10 (6) Art - one unit chosen from the following: Performance course in Music,  
11 Dance, or Theatre; Fine Arts Survey; Art I, II, III, and IV; Talented Art I, II, III, and  
12 IV; Talented Music I, II, III, and IV; Talented Theater Arts I, II, III, and IV; Speech  
13 III and Speech IV (one unit combined); AP Art History; AP Studio Art: 2-D Design;  
14 AP Studio Art: 3-D Design; AP Studio Art: Drawing; AP Music Theory; Film Study  
15 I IB; Film Study II IB; Music I IB; Music II IB; Art Design III IB; Art Design IV IB;  
16 Theatre I IB; or Drafting.

17 (7) For the purposes of this Section, any core curriculum course that is taken  
18 by a student who has been identified as gifted pursuant to State Board of Elementary  
19 and Secondary Education policy and that is taken in fulfillment of the student's  
20 Individualized Education Program shall be considered a gifted course and shall fulfill  
21 the core curriculum requirement in its given subject area."
