2 To amend and reenact R.S. 15:574.4(K), relative to parole; to provide relative to parole 3 eligibility; to provide relative to parole eligibility for certain offenders serving a life 4 sentence; and to provide for related matters. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 6 Section 1. R.S. 15:574.4(K) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 7 §574.4. Parole; eligibility; juvenile offenders 8 9 K. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, an offender serving 10 a life sentence for an offense committed on or before July 2, 1973, and for which the 11 offender pleaded guilty except for those offenders who were originally sentenced to death, shall immediately be eligible for parole consideration. 12
