**Abstract:** Provides relative to penalties for improper supervision of a minor.

Present law (R.S. 14:92.2) provides for the crime of improper supervision of a minor and provides for penalties.

Proposed law retains present law.

Present law (R.S. 14:92.2(B)(2)) provides that whoever violates the provisions of present law (R.S. 14:92.2(A)(3)) shall be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than six months or a fine of \$500, or both. Further provides that whoever violates the provisions of present law, which results in injury to the child that requires medical attention or death of the child, shall be punished by imprisonment for two years with or without hard labor.

Proposed law amends present law to provide that whoever violates the provisions of present law (R.S. 14:92.2), which results in serious bodily injury, shall be punished by a fine of no more than \$1,000 or imprisonment for up to five years with or without hard labor, or both.

Present law (R.S. 14:92.2(B)(3)) provides that whoever violates the provisions of present law (R.S. 14:92.2(A)(4)) shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000, or imprisonment for up to six months, or both.

Proposed law repeals present law.
