HIGHER EDUCATION: Requests that the Board of Regents conduct a study relative to the state's articulation and transfer process with respect to career and technical education courses

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Board of Regents to conduct a study relative to the state's
3	articulation and transfer process with respect to career and technical education
4	courses and to submit a report of findings and conclusions, including any
5	recommendations for related legislation, to the House Committee on Education and
6	the Senate Committee on Education not later than sixty days prior to the 2024
7	Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana.
8	WHEREAS, the Legislature of Louisiana has demonstrated great interest in the
9	articulation and transfer process in postsecondary education for the past several decades; and
10	WHEREAS, Chapter 25-A of Title 17 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950
11	provides for numerous components of articulation and transfer, including the requirement
12	for a statewide articulation agreement that shall, among other matters, guarantee the
13	statewide articulation of appropriate career and technical education programs and workforce
14	development programs; and
15	WHEREAS, some have expressed concern about limitations on the transfer of certain
16	career and technical education credits from the community college level to the four-year
17	institution level; and
18	WHEREAS, in order to further the success of Louisiana's students and strengthen the
19	workforce, it is appropriate that a study be conducted relative to the articulation and transfer

1 process and ways that it can be maximized for the benefit of all students and the state as a 2 whole. 3 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 4 urge and request the Board of Regents to study the state's articulation and transfer process 5 with respect to career and technical education courses and submit a written report of findings 6 and conclusions to the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on 7 Education not later than sixty days prior to the beginning of the 2024 Regular Session of the 8 Legislature of Louisiana. 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report shall include, at minimum, the 10 following: 11 (1) An explanation of any barriers to articulation and transfer with respect to career 12 and technical education courses. 13 (2) Strategies for expanding educational options for graduates of community and 14 technical colleges in terms of courses that will transfer to baccalaureate degree programs if 15 students wish to pursue further education and increase opportunities for advancement in the 16 workplace. 17 (3) Possibilities with respect to designing career and technical education programs 18 in a way that allows articulation and transfer rather than simply aiming for a transition 19 directly to employment. 20 (4) Recommendations for legislation, if any, necessary to remove barriers or 21 otherwise improve educational and workforce outcomes for Louisiana's students. 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted 23 to the chairman of the Board of Regents and the commissioner of higher education.
