EVIDENCE: Provides relative to trained peer support members

AN ACT
To amend and reenact Code of Evidence Article 518(B) and R.S. 40:2411(C)(6) and (7),
relative to trained peer support; to provide for firefighters as trained peer support
members; to provide for peer support training by certain organizations; to provide
for definitions; and to provide for related matters.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
Section 1. Code of Evidence Article 518(B) is hereby amended and reenacted to read
as follows:
Art. 518. Trained peer support member privilege
* * *
B. For purposes of this Section, a "trained peer support member" is an
emergency any of the following persons or entities that provide emotional and moral
support or counseling to an emergency responder who needs those services as a
result of an incident in which the emergency responder was involved while acting
in his official capacity:
(1) An emergency responder or civilian volunteer of an emergency service
agency or entity, who has received training in Critical Incident Stress Management
to provide emotional and moral support to an emergency responder who needs those

1	services as a result of an incident in which the emergency responder was involved		
2	while acting in his official capacity.		
3	(2) A "trained peer support member" also includes a volunteer counselor or		
4	other mental health services provider who has been designated by the emergency		
5	service agency or entity to provide emotional and moral support and counseling to		
6	an emergency responder who needs those services as a result of an incident in which		
7	the emergency responder was involved while acting in his official capacity.		
8	(3) A firefighter who has received peer support training from the		
9	International Association of Fire Fighters.

24	governmental entity who, by virtue of his job duties, provides support to peace		
25	officers, including but not limited to a dispatcher, public safety telecommunicator as		
26	defined in R.S. 40:1131, crime scene and crime laboratory technician, and criminal		
27	analyst.

Abstract: Provides relative to trained peer support members to include firefighters within its definition.

<u>Present law</u> (C.E. Art. 518) includes individuals such as a person who provides emotional and moral support to an emergency responder, an emergency responder, or civilian volunteer in its definition of trained peer support member.

Proposed law (C.E. 518 (B)(3)) expands present law to include firefighters.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 40:2411(C)(6)) defines "peer support training" as training in peer support and critical incident stress conducted by the Southern Law Enforcement Foundation, the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation, Inc., or an equivalent program as approved by the executive director of the La. Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice.

<u>Proposed law</u> (R.S. 40:2411(C)(6)) expands the <u>present law</u> definition to include the International Association of Fire Fighters Peer Support Training.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 40:2411(C)(7)) defines "public safety personnel" as an employee of a governmental agency who provides support to peace officers such as a dispatcher, public safety telecommunicator, crime scene and laboratory technician, and criminal analyst.

<u>Proposed law</u> (R.S. 40:2411(C)(7)) expands the <u>present law</u> definition to include firefighters.
