2	To amend and reenact R.S. 33:2740.67(C)(1), (2), and (7) and to enact R.S.
3	33:2740.67(D)(1)(h), relative to the Baton Rouge North Economic Development
4	District; to provide relative to the governance of the district; to provide relative to
5	rules, regulations, and procedures of the board; to provide with respect to board
6	membership and term of members; to provide for duties of the board of
7	commissioners; to provide for subdistricts; to provide for an effective date; and to
8	provide for related matters.
9	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 33:2740.67(C)(1), (2), and (7) are hereby amended and reenacted and
12	R.S. 33:2740.67(D)(1)(h) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

15	C. Governance. (1) In order to provide for the orderly planning, development,
16	acquisition, construction, and effectuation of the services, improvements, and
17	facilities to be furnished by the district and to provide for the representation in the

18	D. Powers and duties. (1) The district, through the board, shall have and
19	exercise all powers of a political subdivision necessary or convenient for the carrying
20	out of its objects and purposes, including but not limited to the following:

22	(h) To divide the district into four subdistricts and to appoint three
23	persons to serve as advisors for each subdistrict. Each subdistrict shall advise
24	the board on economic development issues related to the subdistrict.

26	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
27	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
28	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
29	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become

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effective on the day following such approval.

Present law provides relative to the Baton Rouge North Economic Development District.

Present law provides that the district shall be comprised of twelve members as follows:

- (1) One member shall be appointed by the state representative for House District No. 29, who shall be a representative of the business community, on a rotating basis beginning in 2022 and every other year thereafter.
- (2) Two members shall be appointed by the state senator for Senate District No. 15.
- (3) One member with a background in economic development shall be appointed by the mayor-president of the parish of East Baton Rouge.
- (4) One member shall be appointed with a community development background located within the district to be selected by a subcommittee formed by the board.
- (5) One member shall be appointed by the owner of the largest parcel of land located within the district.
- (6) One member shall be appointed by the state representative for House District No. 61, on a rotating basis beginning in 2022 and every other year thereafter.
- (7) One member shall be appointed by the state representative for House District No. 63, on a rotating basis beginning in 2022 and every other year thereafter.
- (8) One member shall be appointed by the state representative for House District No. 67, on a rotating basis beginning in 2023 and every other year thereafter.
- (9) One member shall be appointed by the state representative for House District No. 101, on a rotating basis beginning in 2023 and every other year thereafter.
- (10) One member shall be appointed by the state senator for Senate District No. 14.
- One member shall be appointed by the state representative for House District No. 29, on a rotating basis beginning in 2023 and every other year thereafter.

<u>Proposed law provides</u> that the board consists of a total of five members. Two members shall be appointed by the state senator for District No. 14 and three members shall be selected by the state senator for Senate District No. 15.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the board members will serve two-year terms and no more than four cumulative terms.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the board shall adopt such rules and regulations as it deems necessary or advisable for conducting its business affairs. It shall hold regular meetings as shall be provided in the bylaws and may hold special meetings at such times and places within the district as may be prescribed in the bylaws.

Proposed law retains present law but specifies that these rules and regulations shall include

a procedure for the removal of inactive board members.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the board to divide the district into four subdistricts. Each subdistrict shall have three advisors. Each subdistrict shall advise the board on economic development issues related to the subdistrict.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

(Amends R.S. 33:2740.67(C)(1), (2), and (7); adds R.S. 33:2740.67(D)(1)(h))
