Abstract: Requires free school breakfast and lunch for certain public school students.

Present law provides for the provision of school meals. Proposed law:

- (1) Provides that students in grades kindergarten through 12 who qualify for reduced-price meals shall be provided breakfast and lunch at no cost to the student.
- Provides that for each breakfast or lunch served free of charge in accordance with <u>proposed law</u>, the state Dept. of Education shall reimburse the governing authority of a nutrition program provider for the meal an amount equal to the difference between the reimbursement rates provided by the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture for a free meal and a reduced-price meal.
- (3) Provides that <u>proposed law</u> shall be implemented beginning with the 2023-2024 school year and each subsequent school year.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Education to the original bill:

- 1. Limit applicability of <u>proposed law</u> to students who qualify for reduced-price school meals.
- 2. Require reimbursement by the state Dept. of Education.

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Appropriations</u> to the <u>engrossed</u> bill:

- 1. Change the language referencing a "free breakfast and lunch" to "breakfast and lunch at no cost to the student."
- 2. Add language that students eligible for the program shall be in grades kindergarten through 12.
- 3. Change the language referencing the "national school breakfast and school lunch

- programs" to "school breakfast program and national school lunch program."
- 4. Provide that the Department of Education shall reimburse the authority of a school lunch program for each meal served equal to the difference between the reimbursement rates for a free meal and a reduced-price meal as annually determined by the USDA.
