EG SEE FISC NOTE GF EX

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Provides relative to the carrying of concealed firearms by qualified retired law enforcement officers

Current law (La. R.S. 40:1379.1.4(B)(5)) permits an individual who is a qualified retired law enforcement officer to carry a concealed firearm anywhere in the state, including anywhere in the public, if certain criteria are met, including qualifying annually for Peace Officers Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.) Council qualification.

Proposed law would remove the requirement that a qualified retired law enforcement officer qualify annually for P.O.S.T. Council qualification and carry proof of that certification to carry a concealed firearm anywhere in the state, including any place open to the public. Proposed law amends the definition of qualified retired law enforcement officer to only require that a law enforcement officer hold a P.O.S.T. Council qualification (which acknowledges his competence with a handgun) at the time of retirement in accordance with La. R.S. 40:1379.3(D)(1)(f).
