SCHOOLS/FOOD PROGRAMS: Requires free school breakfast and lunch for certain students

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 17:192(B)(3), relative to school meals; to provide that certain students shall
3	be provided free school breakfast and lunch; to provide for applicability; to require
4	reimbursement by the state Department of Education; and to provide for related
5	matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 17:192(B)(3) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	§192. Lunches and breakfasts; duty to furnish

12	(3)(a) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, an eligible
13	student shall be provided breakfast and lunch at no cost to the student.
14	(b) For purposes of this Paragraph, an eligible student is a student in grades
15	kindergarten through twelve who meets the federal eligibility guidelines for reduced
16	price meals by household size and income levels pursuant to the school breakfast
17	program and national school lunch program.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

1 (c) For each breakfast or lunch served free of charge in accordance with this 2 Paragraph, the state Department of Education shall reimburse the governing authority of a school nutrition program for each meal served an amount equal to the 3 4 difference between the reimbursement rates for a free meal and a reduced-priced 5 meal as annually determined by the United States Department of Agriculture. 6 Section 2. The provisions of R.S. 17:192(B)(3) as enacted by this Act shall apply to 7 the 2023-2024 school year and each subsequent school year. 8 Section 3.A. The provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of this Act shall become effective 9 when an Act of the Louisiana Legislature containing a specific appropriation of monies for 10 the implementation of the provisions of this Act becomes effective. 11 B. The provisions of this Section shall become effective upon signature by the 12 governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become 13 law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the 14 Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the 15 legislature, the provisions of this Section shall become effective on the day following such 16 approval.

HB 282 Re-Reengrossed

Abstract: Requires free school breakfast and lunch for certain public school students.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the provision of school meals. <u>Proposed law</u>:

- (1) Provides that students in grades kindergarten through 12 who qualify for reduced-price meals shall be provided breakfast and lunch at no cost to the student.
- Provides that for each breakfast or lunch served free of charge in accordance with proposed law, the state Dept. of Education shall reimburse the governing authority of a nutrition program provider for the meal an amount equal to the difference between the reimbursement rates provided by the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture for a free meal and a reduced-price meal.
- (3) Provides that <u>proposed law</u> shall be implemented beginning with the 2023-2024 school year.

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(4) Provides that <u>proposed law</u> shall become effective when an Act of the legislature containing a specific appropriation of monies for the implementation of <u>proposed</u> law becomes effective.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Education</u> to the original bill:

- 1. Limit applicability of <u>proposed law</u> to students who qualify for reduced-price school meals.
- 2. Require reimbursement by the state Dept. of Education.

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Appropriations</u> to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Change the language referencing a "free breakfast and lunch" to "breakfast and lunch at no cost to the student."
- 2. Add language that students eligible for the program shall be in grades kindergarten through 12.
- 3. Change the language referencing the "national school breakfast and school lunch programs" to "school breakfast program and national school lunch program."
- 4. Provide that the Department of Education shall reimburse the authority of a school lunch program for each meal served equal to the difference between the reimbursement rates for a free meal and a reduced-price meal as annually determined by the USDA.

The House Floor Amendments to the reengrossed bill:

1. Add that <u>proposed law</u> shall become effective when an Act containing a specific appropriation of monies for proposed law implementation becomes effective.
