HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 216

HEALTH/LDH: Urges and requests the Louisiana Department of Health to implement a digital platform to facilitate access to behavioral health services for certain conditions

A RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health to implement a digital platform to
3	facilitate access to behavioral health services for adults with serious mental illness
4	and children with serious emotional disturbance.
5	WHEREAS, serious mental illness commonly refers to a diagnosis of a psychotic
6	disorder, bipolar disorder, or either major depression with psychotic symptoms or
7	treatment-resistant depression; and
8	WHEREAS, serious mental illness may also include anxiety disorders, eating
9	disorders, and personality disorders, if the degree of functional impairment is severe; and
10	WHEREAS, serious mental illnesses may be long-term and involve substantial
11	functional impairment that often leads to an inability to maintain gainful employment, poor
12	social support, repeated psychiatric hospitalizations, homelessness, incarceration, and
13	coexisting substance use disorders; and
14	WHEREAS, in 2019, over fifteen out of one hundred thousand Louisiana residents
15	died by suicide; and
16	WHEREAS, in 2021, more than fifty-five out of one hundred thousand Louisiana
17	residents died from drug overdoses; and
18	WHEREAS, in 2021, almost twenty percent of adults, ages eighteen through
19	forty-four, in Louisiana reported frequent mental health distress; and

1	WHEREAS, since the COVID pandemic began, over thirty-two percent of adults in
2	Louisiana reported having symptoms of serious depression or anxiety; and
3	WHEREAS, children with severe emotional disturbance are persons under the age
4	of eighteen who have had a diagnosable mental, behavioral, or emotional disorder of
5	sufficient duration to meet diagnostic criteria specified within the most current Diagnostic
6	and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders that resulted in functional impairment which
7	substantially interferes with or limits the child's ability to participate in family, school, or
8	community activities; and
9	WHEREAS, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration has
10	identified a digital platform to facilitate access to behavioral health services for adults with
11	serious mental illness and children with a serious emotional disturbance as an approved
12	expenditure through Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration block
13	grants to support efforts to connect individuals with services in their area; and
14	WHEREAS, a digital platform could provide access to services in a wide variety of
15	settings, including mental health services, suicide prevention, and veterans' affairs that
16	would greatly benefit the residents of Louisiana; and
17	WHEREAS, a Louisiana-specific digital platform which makes it easier for
18	individuals to find local behavioral health services would be a valuable resource to Louisiana
19	residents; and
20	WHEREAS, Louisiana continues to face unprecedented challenges with substance
21	abuse, violent crime, and suicide, making the need to connect residents with resources even
22	more vital than ever.
23	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the
24	Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health
25	to implement a digital platform to facilitate access to behavioral health services for adults
26	with serious mental illness and children with serious emotional disturbance.
